

## **Treasurer's Report**

- Our income this year has been almost totally through membership subscriptions. Due to the limited face-to-face meetings, we have only collected £3.00 in visitor's fees.
- The Club membership is currently 31 which is more than the previous years and includes some members who live further away and can only access the meetings via Zoom.
- Due to being in credit with St Aldhelm's at the first lockdown we have not had to pay anything further for room hire during 2021-22. But we expect to get an invoice from the Church Centre in September to cover the period September to December.
- FAS fees have remained the same at £53.

## **Treasurer's Report**

- Refreshments have been donated so far this year and therefore the cost to the Club has been £0.00
- We continue to give our external speakers a small donation, usually in the form of Amazon vouchers to cover any expenses they may have incurred (such as a Zoom or internet subscription) although sometimes they invoice us instead. These costs have come to £130 in total.
- We started to incur bank charges at the HSBC and therefore during the year we have moved Club funds to the Great Western Credit Union. Although not quite as flexible as the HSBC account, there are no charges for their services.
- Overall, the Club has made a small profit of £15.90 this year.
